PSU is a multi-campus institution with more than 35,000 students, inclusive of international students from 53 nations, and over 2,000 academic staff. Each campus is committed to academic excellence, strong social responsibility and active engagement in community services. The total area of the five campuses is 622 hectares (3.887 rai).

PSU's main campus is located in the city of Hat Yai, a sprawling commercial hub and shopping destination in Songkhla province, the center of trade and economy of the major provinces in the Lower South. **Hat Yai Campus**, with its attractive landscape, provides a serene setting ideal for education and learning and is the center of various disciplines.

The city of Hat Yai is about 60 km from the Malaysian border, one hour flying from Bangkok and 30 km from the beautiful tropical long beaches of Songkhla. It is a modern city, with a vibrant mix of Thai, Chinese, and Malay influences, making Hat Yai a thrill to visit with many cultural and modern entertainment attractions.

Pattani Campus, situated on the seafront in Pattani Province, is a campus with a multicultural society, the center of diverse cultures and traditions, and rich in resources. It offers education in Social Sciences, Humanities, Fine and Applied Arts, Political Science, Education, Islamic Studies, Communication Technology, Rubber and Polymer, Food Technology and Fisheries, corresponding with the context of resources and cultural life of residents of the Lower South, with their own identities. One of the main studying features of the Pattani Campus is that it embraces the Faculty of Islamic Studies where Arabic, Islamic theology and Shari'ah subjects are in high demand.

Phuket Campus is set on the island of Phuket, also known as the Pearl of the Andaman Sea. The island is well-known worldwide for being a tourist attraction and a busy center of hotel industry and services that suit both national and international tourism. 
Trang Campus, situated on a plain in the most populated province of the West Coast of the South, focuses on education in Commerce and Management, to support trade and investment in the region.

In order to study at PSU, you need to apply for a non-immigrant "ED" visa and an international health & accident insurance. Shortly after being accepted to PSU, you will receive a formal Acceptance Letter (LoA) necessary to apply for this student visa.

Apply for Non-immigrant "Ed" visa (Student Visa)

You should apply for a Non-immigrant "Ed" Visa at the Royal Thai Embassy or Consulate in your country by providing the following documents:

- > Passport with validity not less than 6 months and photocopy, > Financial Statement
- > Visa application form completely filled out,
- > Two recent photographs of the applicant (4 x 6 cm.),
- > Acceptance Letter (LoA) from PSU,
- > Academic record and Student ID (if currently studying),
- > Visa fee

- > Some countries may request a Visa Approval Letter issued by the Thai Ministry of Foreign Affairs; please inform your faculty at PSU about this.

Arrange accommodation and make travel arrangements

Arranging accommodation:

You may opt for an accommodation either on or off campus. We advise you to finalize your living arrangements before arriving at PSU.

On-Campus Dormitory:

Many students find that living on campus is a great way to meet new people and become familiar with PSU's green and relaxing surroundings, while being in a safe and secured environment. International students will be accommodated in rooms with other students of the same gender in selected on-campus dormitories.

How to apply for on-campus housing?

Please book your accommodation as early as possible. It is advised to book your on-campus housing at least one (1) month prior to your arriving date to PSU. In case of any difficulties with the online booking system, please contact your faculty to book a room or contact Student Affairs at **dorm.psu.ac.th**

Off-Campus Dormitory:

Some foreigners may opt to lease housing in town. Most apartments and the surrounding areas are similar to studio apartments - a single room with a restroom and balcony.

How to book off-campus housing?

Please contact the International Affairs officer/ adviser at your faculty at PSU, in order for them to help you book an off-campus accommodation.

Getting to your

campus:

The first thing you should plan is to arrive at PSU at least one week before the term begins, in order for you to have time to make the final arrangements for your comfortable setting. This will also give you time to become acquainted with the campus and city before classes begin. Be sure that you inform your faculty's contact well in advance about your arrival date at PSU.

Most international students travel to Thailand by air. Remember that PSU campuses are located in the South of Thailand, at about one hour and fifteen minutes flying from Bangkok. We suggest traveling to Bangkok by air, and then taking a flight from Suvarnabhumi or Don Muang International Airport at your convenience to the campus's city location. However, for Pattani campus, there is no direct flight from Bangkok, therefore you have to take a van or taxi from Hat Yai city to the campus.

Getting ready for classes:

PSU Student Information System



PSU uses an internet-based system for managing student records called **Student Information System (SIS)**. You will use SIS to register for courses, but first you will have to receive a PSU Passport from your faculty. Once you arrive at PSU, the faculty will contact the Registrar's Office.

Through this Passport you will have access to the university's student system, where you can find your classes schedule, financial records, transcript and other important information regarding your study at PSU.

Student Identification Card



Students should apply for a permanent ID card at the Siam Commercial Bank. You will need the ID cards to access the library service and university facilities.



Immigration Procedures

Notification of Residence: PSU foreign students and staff must notify their residence to local immigration authorities within 24 hours after the first arrival in Thailand.

One-year Visa Extension for Students: A foreign student must enter Thailand with a Non-immigrant "Ed" visa, obtained from the Royal Thai Embassy / Consulate in his/her country. The validity of this visa is three months and once in Thailand, student can apply for an extension of stay for one year at the related Immigration Office in Thailand before the expiry date mentioned on the first stamp you get upon entering Thailand. After receiving the extension, one should check that the extension date is correct. The last visa extension may be shorter than one year, depending on student's graduation date. If the one-year visa expires, there is a fine of 500 Baht per day, but not exceeding 20,000 Baht in total. A ban from entering Thailand for a certain number of days may also apply.

90-day Report: A foreigner staying in Thailand for a period longer than 90 days and holding a Non-Immigrant Visa is required by the Thai Immigration to report the current address every 90 days. He /she must file this report within 15 days before or 7 days after the 90-day-period expires. If not you will be fined 2,000 Baht. However, you leave Thailand anytime during the 90-day period, then the day-count will restart upon the re-entry date into Thailand.

Re-entry Permit: If you are holding a single entry visa or extension of stay and planning to travel abroad must obtain a Re-entry Permit before their departure, otherwise their visa will be invalidated and they will have to go through the whole process of getting the proper visa at a Thai Embassy or Consulate outside Thailand. The Re-entry Permit must be obtained from the Immigration Office before leaving Thailand. Other wise, your One - year visa extension will be invalidated.
