- [khâ?] (female speaker) polite ending particle of a statement or to show that one is listening
- [khráp] (male speaker) polite ending particle used when asking a question, making a statement and showing that one is listening

[mǎj/ (formal style)      ending particles  
[máj] (casual style)      of yes/no questions

[ʔàʔ-raj]      what (used at the end of a question  
and in this lesson the answer  
is a fruit and its color)

# Sentence patterns

[núa maŋ-khút mii sǐi khǎaw]

The flesh of the mangosteen is white.

The mangosteen has white flesh.

[plùak maŋ-khút mii sǐi mûaŋ]

The rind of the mangosteen is purple.

[núa tɛɛŋ-moo mii sǐi dɛɛŋ]

The flesh of the watermelon is red.

[plùak tɛɛŋ-moo mii sǐi khǎaw]

The rind of the watermelon is green.

[sôm kàp tɛɛŋ-moo mii máʔ-lét]

Oranges and watermelons have seeds.

[sàp-pàʔ-rót mâj-mii máʔ-lét]

Pineapples have no seeds.

[chán chồp kin thú?-rian khâ?]

I like to eat durian.

[phỏm mâj chồp kin klûaj khráp]

I don't like to eat banana.
